

Pedralbes: for all audiences

The prestigious list of musicians performing at the Festival Jardins de Pedralbes on the weekend of 11 and 12 June is an indication of the excellent state of this event. Artists include the Irish group The Cranberries, led by Dolores O'Riordan; the Galician artist Car-

los Núñez and Celtic Legends; the Peruvian tenor Juan Diego Flórez; the Germanduo Milky Chance; the British singer-songwriter James Morrison; Miguel Bosé; the legendary Charles Aznavour; The Lumineers, as well as Paolo Conte, Tom Jones, George Benson, Toquinho, Maria Creuza, Joan Baez and others.

The festival will even include cinema, with screenings of films like Indianalones and the Raiders of the Lost Ark and The Artist, with each film's original soundtrack performed live by the Vallès Symphony Orchestra conducted by Ernstvan Tiel. And dining experiences with the Roca brothers.

The festival will devote two days to family audiences with its Family Music Day by MiniMúsica (June 28), including concerts, workshops and activities related to music, entertainment and snacks for the kids. It will also host a gastro-musical day by SoundEat on July 16, combining the best up-andcoming DJs with various creative cuisine ideas based on the fledgling food truck model. Sónar 2016

Music, creativity and technology. The doyen of Barcelona's major festivals, Sónar, arrives with renewed vigour, taking place in the Sónar by Day and Sónar by Nightareas on June 16, 17 and 18. Among the more than 150 performances include two European newcomers: the debut of ANOHNI (the new project of the singer from Antony & The Johnsons in collaboration with the producers Oneohtrix Point Never and Hudson Mohawke) and the presentation of Become Ocean, an orchestral work on climate change by America's John Luther Adams.

Primavera Sound

Three of the cornerstones that have made Primavera Sound one of the greatest European festivals, as shown by its 15-year history, are its urban context, music until dawn and major stars. And extra proof is that nearly half of the 175,000 people attending arrive from outside of Spain. Three days of rock, indie and electronic music, but also hip hop and heavy metal. Bruce Davidson: 'Blasts' of reality

PORTRAITS BY BRUCE DAVIDSON, THE INFLUENCE OF PUNK IN CONTEMPORARY ART AND A FORGOTTEN 16TH-CENTURY PAINTER: THREE MAJOR ART EVENTS

He captured the spirit of New York's Harlem district and its inhabitants, portrayed the problems of misery and neglect suffered by teenagers in Brooklyn on his Leica, encapsulated the defence of civil rights in the USA... The New York subway or Central Parkwas also caught by his lens, as were other parts of the world, such as Chicago, Mexico, Sicily, Spain... Many of the photographs by America's Bruce Davidson, including his most emblematic series of works produced between 1995 and 2013, can now be seen at Barcelona's Sala Fundación MAPFRE.

Davidson (Oak Park, Illinois, 1933) is one of the leading figures of documentary photography, one of the greatest photographers of the prestigious Magnum Agency who flourished in the

THE PHOTOGRAPHS OF AMERICA'S BRUCE DAVIDSON POSSESS NOT **ONLY GREAT HISTORICAL VALUE, BUT ABOVE ALL GREAT HUMAN VALUE**

1960s. He was not your usual street photographer, nor a conventional photojournalist. His snapshots are valuable for their immediacy and authenticity, but above all they exude sincerity. They are like 'blasts' or flashes of reality. His clear, compassionate eye reflects the condition of modern man and none of his subjects lose their dignity, regardless of their race, culture or social status-in aword, their circumstances. Alongside their undeniable historical value, Davidson's photographs also possess a great human value, as evidenced by this major retrospective of his work in Barcelona.

The images in the show are divided into various subjects and follow a chronological order, including what is probably Davidson's most famous project: '1966-1968. East 100th Street.' This series comprises photographs taken in Spanish Harlem, a New York district-cum-ghetto inhabited by blacks and Latinos. It was there that he portrayed entire families, men, women and children, in the streets or in their homes. In its day the series was exhibited at MoMA. ♦

FIRE, CAVA AND COCAS ARE THE STARS OF BARCELONA'S SHORTEST, MOST MAGICAL NIGHT OF THE YEAR. THE CITY DOESN'T SLEEP ON IUNE 23

To celebrate the much-awaited beginning of summer is the main goal of the city's most famous festival: Sant Joan, which is celebrated in style on

the shortest night of the year, June 23. Each neighbourhood enjoys its own festive verbena during this special Barcelona event and bonfires are litthroughout the city. Along with piec-

es of junk, bad omens are also burnt in these fires in a symbolic act of renewal.

Fun is always assured in this socalled "Night of Fire", with teeming dinners in the streets, firework dis-

plays, devils and correfocs, bands and dances continuously staged. And as dictated by tradition, cava and cocas are ever-present. These traditional sweets can be found in any of the countless pastry shops in the city and come in various varieties: candied fruit, pine nuts, crackling, custard or cream... Each of them brilliantly serves

to sweeten the evening.

Although the Sant Joan festival celebrates the birth of John the Baptist (June 24), it dates back to long before Christianity appeared. In fact, its origins are lost in the

mists of time and it originally served to scare away evil spirits. The festival involved sun worshipping and was a way of trying to lengthen the day. It thus celebrated the summer solstice and is still packed with symbolism even today. The most important of these is fire as purification. Whether at outdoor parties, in

clubs and discos or on a sandy beach, the verbena lasts until dawn. And for many, the most magical night of the year is best culminated with a dip in the sea, another outstanding tradition.

Whatever the case, June 23 in Barcelona marks the beginning of summer...




