

## NEVER FAR FROM THE SEA, WITH SWIMSUITS AT THE READY

#### **LAS GOLONDRINAS - PORT**

Embarks from Moll de Drassanes. Portal de la Pau, s/n. Daily 11.15am-8.30pm. Adults €7.20. Kids (ages 4-9) €2.80.

The history of Las Golondrinas goes all the way back to 1988 when, during Barcelona's Universal Exposition, these catamaran-style sightseeing boats took their debut sail around the sea. One hundred twenty-six years later, the same company still offers daily cruises out along the city's seafront. Their bestknown route visits Barcelona's port on a 40-minute trip that takes in the structure of the Maremagnum shopping centre, the Porta d'Europa bridge, the harbour clock tower, the 18th-century lighthouse and the fivevear-old W Hotel.

#### **SAILING TRIPS**

Starts from Port Olímpic, moorings 2861 and 2862. Trips last 2.5 hours. Daily 11am & 5pm. Adults €45.59. Kids (4-11) €24.70. Free for under-4s.

Imagine yourself as part of the perfect image of an August afternoon on the Mediterranean (as seen on TV!), diving headfirst into the sea from the deck of a boat. On this trip you can learn basic sailing techniques from a professional skipper, aboard a 12-metre sailing boat. They also offer the option of an 8-hour excursion that sets off from Barcelona's Port Olimpic and ends up in Port d'Aiguadolç in Sitges, for a maximum of 10 people.

#### **CATAMARANS**

Starts from Port Olímpic, at the end of C/Marina (between the Mapfre tower and the Hotel Arts). Fri 12pm. Sat & Sun 11am, 2.30pm & 6pm. Adults €46. Kids (2-12) €23.



If the idea of anchoring off the coast of Barcelona and enjoying the sun and the sea from the sundeck of a sailing catamaran sounds pretty good, this outing is for you. And they won't let you go hungry or thirsty: there's an onboard buffet with grilled Catalan sausages followed by fresh fruit salad. To quench your thirst, you can take your pick of water, soft drinks, beer or sangria.

#### **PADDLE SURF & KAYAK**

Meeting point: Centre Municipal de Vela-CMV. Moll del Gregal, s/n - Port Olímpic (Barcelona). Daily. 1 hour rental €15. Ages 6+.

If you've been to the beach recently, you've seen fans of water sports paddling while standing upright on what look like surfboards. These fun-seekers are not looking in vain for waves, but just cruising peacefully on a calm sea. This is paddle surf, a relaxing, enjoyable activity that some say simulates the sensation of walking on the water. But if you want to go further afield, it's probably a bit easier to hire a kayak and explore the coastline at your own pace.

#### **JET SKI**

Meeting point: marquee on Moll de Marina, on the corner with the Moll de Mestral. Daily 10am-7pm. 1 hour (2 people): €180. Half hour (2 people): €100.

If you're looking for an exciting way to discover Barcelona's seafront, these aquatic motorbikes are just the



ticket. With an independent guide who leads the trip from their own jet ski, you can enjoy views of the beaches and Barcelona's skyline at top speed, on the back of a 130hp jet ski. No previous experience is required to drive one. But you won't be left completely to your own devices: before the trip, you'll receive a short introductory presentation.

#### **FLYBOARD**

Its proponents claim that flyboarding comes incredibly close to the sensation of flying. Whether that's true or not, it's a new sport that has revolutionised seaside fun. The basic equipment is a board that propels riders into the air on two pressurised water jets, powered by a jet ski or a motorboat. Boarders manoeuvre in the air by tilting their feet, allowing them to perform acrobatics and impossible-looking

ride a bike or to water-ski, requiring only a good sense of balance. If you want proof of your daring deeds, for an extra £20 you can take away a batch of photos.

#### **BEACH BIKE TOUR**

Riding a bicycle on a sunny day is one of summer's little pleasures, made even better if vou're riding beside the sea. This route follows traffic-free roads, pedestrian zones and bike lanes, and is led by a guide, with stops at points of interest along the way. From the Columbus monument you pedal past the Drassanes royal shipyards, the Port Vell old port, the Palau del Mar. Barceloneta and its beaches, Port Olímpic, the Fòrum, Diagonal Mar Park, Poblenou and the Vila Olímpica before arriving in Ciutadella Park. The tour includes bike rental, guide, a drink, helmets, and kids' seats if required.

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## **BEACHES**

## THE BEST SPOTS TO SPREAD OUT YOUR TOWEI

#### **BARCELONETA**

#### Barceloneta (L4)

Together with neighbouring Sant Sebastià beach, this is the largest and best-known of Barceloneta's beaches. It takes it name from the city's maritime quarter par excellence, built in the 18th century by citizens expelled from the Ribera district after the siege of 1714. The construction of the Passeig Maritim, in the late 20th century, connected the district to Port Olimpic. It also wiped away all trace of the popular beach bars, where Barcelonans enjoyed their Sunday paella before Olympic fever hit the city.

#### **SANT SEBASTIÀ**

#### Barceloneta (L4)

The old city's beach, next to the port, also includes what has historically been known as Sant Miquel beach, which corresponds to a large chunk of the Barceloneta district's seafront. More than a kilometre of sandy shoreline, accessible on foot from the city centre, where Barcelona natives mix with tourists. The south-western end. closest to the W Hotel, offers

perfect views of the Barcelona coastline, from the three chimneys of the old power station to the solar panel on the Fòrum, the Olympic port and Barceloneta beach. In the area directly in front of the swimming clubs there's a proud tradition of nudism, and an area popular with the city's gay community.

#### **NOVA ICÀRIA**

#### Ciutadella (L4)

The architect who designed Barcelona's street plan, Idefons Cerdà. had his own utopian dreams of a city. which he intended to call Icària, after the ideal island imagined by the French socialist Étienne Cabet, And it was Barcelona's Olympic dreams that allowed it to create Nova Icària, one of the city's most popular beaches. At 400m long, it sits in the middle of the city's shoreline. Like Bogatell beach, it's relatively peaceful, but it's also one of the city's best-equipped beaches, with sporting and leisure facilities. For decades, this area of coast was occupied by Somorrostro, a shanty town that was home to thousands of families, and was the birthplace of the great flamenco dancer Carmen Amaya.

watercourse that once flowed from Vilapicina in the hills, along the route of the avenue of the same name, to the sea. The settlement of Bogatell was populated by fishermen who lived with the foul smell of the municipal sewers that discharged into the sea at this point. Like much of Barcelona's shoreline, Bogatell beach underwent comprehensive renovations from the 1980s onwards, and is now one of the most popular beaches in the city.

#### **MAR BELLA**

#### Selva de Mar (L4)

At the beginning of the 20th century, this was the location of the Mar Bella baths, which survived until the 1940s, when they were destroyed in a storm. During that period, this strip of beach enjoyed a high level of prestige amongst Barcelonans, but went into decline in the 1950s. The process of renovating the city's coastline set in motion by the 1992 Olympic Games reclaimed the beaches of Mar Bella and La Nova Mar Bella. The former can boast some striking contrasts. As well as a nudist sector, at the other end of the beach there's a play area (note the fantastic slide) where kids can let off steam. It's also a popular place for beach volleyball and football.

#### LA NOVA MAR BELLA Selva de Mar (L4)

The name Mar Bella is a reminder of the area on which the Barceloneta district was built. A marbella, written as a single word, is an area of land reclaimed from the sea to become the foundation of a seafaring neighbourhood. Split into two, this word is the source of the names of these two beaches. La Nova Mar Bella is the beach most popular with women (60 percent of users) and young people. It's the perfect

beach for anyone with a disability, with walkways leading down to the sea, volunteers on hand to help, and even a crane truck if required. These services must be requested in advance from the information centre on the beach, and users of the services must be accompanied by at least one adult


#### **LLEVANT**

#### Selva de Mar (L4)

The newest of Barcelona's beaches is the result of putting into practice the revolutionary utopian ideal of finding sand under the paving stones. This two-year-old beach came into being with the removal of the blocks of concrete that made up the Prim breakwater, part of the transformation of the Diagonal Mar district. Its youth means that Llevant is the beach with fewest facilities and services: there aren't even any beach bars. But it's also the most relaxed and private of the city's beaches, perfect for families and loners in search of a bit of peace. A large undeveloped area currently serves as a car park, making it easier to access the beach by car.

#### FÒRUM BATHING ZONE Maresme/Fòrum (L4)

A beach without sand. At the Forum you can take a dip, but not on a traditional beach: this is an area won back from the sea with tons of concrete. At the Forum's bathing area a stretch of seashore has been tamed to transform it into a giant. shallow, saltwater swimming pool, ideal for a splash. Many visitors are not aware that the Fòrum development was built on top of the Camp de la Bota, the area between Barcelona and Sant Adrià, the site of a tragic episode in the city's history. This is where many victims of Franco's reprisals were taken to be shot after the Civil War, as commemorated by the memorial on the esplanade that leads to the bathing area, paying homage to more than 1,700 victims.



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## **Pulse of the times**

Choosing the best of Catalan creativity from the last 15 years is no easy task. Arts Santa Mònica accepts the challenge, and **Maria Junyent** takes note

What do Albert Serra, Néstor F., Yago Hortal, Josep Bunyesc, the Novarama collective, Carles Congost, Jordi Galceran and Emiliana Design have in common? They're all creators who have developed their own languages within the last 15 years, and they were all 'made in Catalonia'. Ricard Mas, the curator of the exhibition that brings together these artists, accepted an ambitious task from Arts Santa Mônica: to survey the state of contemporary Catalan creativity.

To do that, he had to define some limits. His final criteria were those who had contributed something new to their discipline over the last 15 years, had spent their formative years in Catalonia – and would agree to be part of the

exhibition. Even after narrowing it down with specialists in each field there are architects and cooks, as well as fine artists—the list was still enormous.

The exhibition is divided into three sections: tradition, perception and investigation. Or past, present and future. 'Tradition, because we all look back to the past, even if it's only to refute it,' explains Mas, 'perception, because the experience of creation involves the fivesenses, and investigation, because that is the process that is necessary to reach the final product—whatever that may be.

## **Mexico at the Gamper**

Every August, Camp Nou prepares to host the Joan Gamper Trophy, an annual friendly held in honour of FC Barcelona's founder that serves both as a warm-up for the team before official competitions begin and a way of introducing new players to the fans.

This year the Gamper cup will pit the team against Club León de Guanajuato (Mexico), currently home to ex-Barça defender Rafa Marquez, a club that has won seven league and five cup titles since it was founded in 1944. This will be the first time the Mexican team has played in Barça's summer competition.

The main attractions of the Gamper cup this year will be the presence of Luis Enrique as the club's new coach, and the presentation of



new signings: Ter Stegen, Ivan Rakitic, Deolofeu, Rafinha and Masip. Camp Nou will also pay homage to Carles Puyol and Victor Valdés, two iconic players who left the team this summer. –M.J.

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## **Exquisite mistake**

**Ricard Mas** is impressed with American artist Roni Horn's work, which is currently on exhibition in Barcelona for the first time

Whether you sleep as if the universe were a mistake or not, a Barcelona summer in no way resembles Iceland. It's virtually impossible to find a place to be alone. Silence is a luxury. But in the exhibition that Roni Horn has brought to the Miró Foundation, it's possible to step back and believe for a moment that we inhabit an unsettling, almost motionless, universe, sewn up with literary fragments that dance to the impatient rhythm of glaciers.

Roni Horn, born in New York in 1955, is unclassifiable. So much so that she plays with indefinition. Her name, her appearance... 'My identity was shaped around being neither a man nor a woman,' she says. Nor does she have a preferred style or technique. She begins with working drawings that can end up taking shape as photos, objects, installations or other forms.

What we can say is that that her work addresses themes such as identity, landscape, light, words, faces, glass, water and the weather. And most have been conceived in Iceland.

This is the first time Roni Horn has shown her work in Barcelona.

While viewing the exhibition, built to the millimetre for Horn, who has dispensed with curators, we find iconic works such as 'You are the Weather. Part 2', made of 100 portraits of the same woman bathing in hot springs in Iceland. It would seem that Roni Horn's universe is something of a mistake. But an exquisite one.

## Painting Barcelona landscapes

Picasso lived in Barcelona for just nine vears, but that was long enough to link the artist's name to the city forever. He was 14 when his family moved to the city, at a time when Art Nouveau, in its local guise of Modernisme, was the order of the day. That is where everything began,' he said later, 'where I understood how far I could go.' It's where he spent the crucial years of his artistic education. He often painted what he saw from the windows of his studio (C/de la Riera de Sant Ioan. 1900), or views of the coast ('Man Sitting in La Barceloneta', 1895). These are the works of a Picasso who still had one foot in the academy, and clung to the landscape. He tried out his palette and his line, discovered artistic cliques and Bohemian nightlife, put on his first exhibition at Els 4 Gats. At 22.

## Long life of a classic

The restaurant Els Ocellets, the little brother to Can Lluís, celebrates turning 30 on excellent form. By **Ricard Martín** 

Els Ocellets is very much a family place. They say they want you to feel at home. And those aren't empty words: Xavier Rodríguez, the owner, deals out kisses, hugs and 'darling's left and right, the way friendly Valencians call everyone 'king' or 'cousin'. Now this natural warmth has turned into euphoria: his restaurant, a local institution on Ronda Sant Pau, has racked up 30 years, no mean feat. The regulars know it, and tonight feels like—is—a party.

The little brother has grown up. Els Ocellets first opened in 1984 as an appendix to Can Lluís, which was overwhelmed by its own success in the shadowy depths of C/de la Cera. 'The original idea was to take all the groups that couldn't get into Can Lluís,' says Rodríguez. But only a few weeks after opening, they saw the place 'had a life of its own, it was filling up because of its own momentum'. Far from replicating his brother Ferran's cooking, Xavier decided on a style that was 'less about classic recipes, more up to date'. This should be taken with a pinch of salt in a restaurant where for 30 years the policy has been 'to improve and maintain what works, and eliminate what doesn't'.





Fresh produce (excellent fish and seafood) has saved this style of cookery from folkloric fossilisation. They do what they do, and they do it very well. Starters such as the cod cheek carpaccio, delicious and summery, with just a touch of fresh tomato and herbs, or the *foie gras a la sal*, served with a glass of muscatel, are examples of their philosophy: providing excellent food for under 630. Els Ocellets may serve half portions, but it's not a tapas bar: it's a true restaurant, where businesspeople and bohemians sit down for a meal.

I ask whether it's a problem to have your own brother as the competition, 30 metres away. Xavier doesn't say anything, as Ferran himself suddenly walks in and gives him a hug. Xavier then answers, 'There's no competition!'

## Sitges The rum museum



Rum is a drink that has inspired the same obsessive devotion as whisky. In fact, the story of Bacardi could provide Scorsese with enough material for an epic movie: the founder of the company, Facundo Bacardi sailed to Cuba in 1830 and set up an international business that has survived war and revolution. In his home town, Sitges, you'll find Casa Bacardi, a museum that tells the fascinating story of the family and the rum-making business with hands-on experiences.

The museum building is of historical interest in itself: it's the town's old market, a Modernista structure designed in 1980 by Gaietà Buigas. In the Heritage space, you can discover the story of the brand and its connection with Sitges. Next comes a journey through the history of rum, which explains how it is made, along with a few house secrets. In the last section, it's time for some fun: a master class in making classic cocktails such as mojitos, cuba libres, daiquiris and piña coladas.

## Language of flowers

Montse Liarte's turns to the world of flowers to create her summer collection. By **Eugènia Sendra** 

The Born continues to exercise its charm and magnetic effect on the community of local creators looking for their place in the world. The latest arrival – who won't be the last – is Monste Liarte. Surrounded by photographs, floral scents and a grandfather clock, this is where her spring-summer collection, Florvm, took shape – a look back at the history of the universe of flowers.

She loves to do the research for each new season, and this time turned to the very first botany books, illustrated by women, as well as the flowing brushstrokes of Impressionist canvases. The results are pieces that are more romantic and less geometric than her previous work. But these are still clothes with plenty of character, despite her abandoning black for floral prints. The Liarte essence survives: she uses

silk, jacquard cotton, lurex and tulle to create ultra-feminine dresses. The finishing touches are shamelessly hand-crafted, and the linings are impeccable. These are the signatures of a small firm that backs local manufacturers as a matter of conviction, and uses its store to raise the profile of designer friends.

Montse Liarte was part of the generation helped by the Projecte Bressol programme for emerging designers — a contemporary of Manuel Bolaño, Krizia Robustella and Nera Lurgain, among others — and after several 080 Barcelona Fashion weeks, she has taken a step back from catwalk shows to work at a different pace.



The Royal Monastery of St Mary of Pedralbes was founded by Queen Elisenda de Montcada as a retreat to withdraw to when she became a widow. It is the personal work of a queen who sought to express her ideas about religious life, ensure the salvation of her soul and find a place to live out in dignity the role of a widowed and childless queen.

Six hundred and fifty years after the death of Queen Elisenda, her work still endures and has become one of the finest examples of Catalan Gothic art. 
