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

This copy editor with a passion for drawing became an illustrator with a passion for literature. By **Ada Castells**

Your background is in editing, but one day you picked up a pencil and became an illustrator – how did that happen?

It started because I was fed up with my job. I enjoyed working as a copy editor, but I'd been in publishing for a long time, and I didn't like being stuck in an office. I value my freedom and the excitement of trying something new. So I gave up the job and, almost instinctively said to myself: I need to start drawing.

And what was the first result of your big leap?

The man who drew bears, in 2009, a story I wrote myself. That same year I illustrated Dickens' Christmas Carol, and Hans Christian Andersen's Ugly Duckling, in a verse version by Antoni Dalmases.

How has your experience as an editor helped you?

A lot, especially in my work with

literature, because of the insight it gives you. Any illustrator needs to be well read, and I've always been part of that world.

It must have been easy to find work with your crisp, clear style.

No, you'd be surprised. In Catalonia, for many years now, the trend has been for a more child-like style of illustration – not that there's anything wrong with that. It places more emphasis on storytelling than on realism. My style is the opposite. Is there more variety in other

They keep a more open mind. Then you must have had an unusual education.

I come from a family of artists.

BISTROT DE SANTS

Class over the tracks

In rural towns across Catalonia, the most reliable choice for a warm welcome and hearty home cooking is traditionally the hotel nearest the railway station. And directly above Sants station you'll find Hotel Barceló-although its bistro adds a little sophistication to the formula, as well as views of Montjuïc. The food strikes the same balance between tradition and innovation, seasonal products and new takes on traditional recipes, with wild mushrooms featuring prominently on autumn menus. As well as their excellent

mushroom carpaccios - ou de reig (Caesar's mushroom) with artichokes, or ceps with ham and pine nuts - their wild mushroom stew with poached egg and shavings of cured ham is unmissable.

CAN VALLÈS

Deluxe dining

This outwardly unassuming restaurant boasts one of the best seasonal menus in Barcelona. Run by



owners Jordi and Pedro with all the savoir faire and good humour of long experience, it specialises in Galician seafood, the freshest fresh fish and delicious cuts of beef. But the trick is to look out for the daily specials. which depend on what's available at the market - always the most logical approach when it comes to wild mushrooms. Their homemade botifarra de perol, a traditional pork offal sausage served with wild mushrooms, is spectacular, as are their ous de reig - Caesar's mushrooms - served with foie gras. But this season's highlight is their carpaccio of ous dereig with quail's eggs, parmesan and payoyo, a tangy goats' cheese from Cadiz.

CASA LUCIO Spirit of the market

It's not actually inside a market, but Casa Lucio captures the spirit of Barcelona's market eateries. It's a cosy space with a vintage aesthetic, where you can eat tapas-style at the bar or in the small dining room at the back. Lucio himself is the master of ceremonies, reciting the dishes of the day (which are prepared offstage by his wife Maribel) and recommending wines to accompany them-their wine list is one of their strong points. The menu varies from season to season and from day to day, but the specials are always fresh, and always delicious. This is the place to try more unusual mushroom varieties: whitefleshed llanegas, in a tart orange and truffle escabetx marinade; scrambled eggs with greixa, a creamy yellow mushroom with curly tips, or salt cod carpaccio with clams and chanterelles. For real fans, there's their barrejat de bolets, a wild mushroom gratin with horn of plenty, yellow foot and tiny Finnish shiitake, baked in a truffle béchamel.

Italian love their fungi, and although from a Catalan perspective they seem to focus on just two types, those two are possibly the best of all: porcini and the white truffle—the Alba Madonna—one of nature's little miracles. Daviano, a graphic designer by training, opened I Buoni Amici ('good friends') in the early 90's, so he



could dedicate himself full-time to his real passion: food. His fantastic pappardelle pasta with duck ragout and fungi porcini is a fixture on the menu, but now that the white truffle is in season, look out for special dishes that pay homage to the most intense—and expensive—of autumn flavours.

Fungi Fusion

Catalans tend to consider themselves the greatest wild mushroom-lovers in the world. It's true, the region is rich in different edible species, and collecting them is hugely popular, for some almost an obsession. But they have serious competition: in Japan. mushrooms have been considered a delicacy for hundreds of years, and their cultivation has been raised to fine art. At Kov Shunka you'll find the ultimate fusion of these two traditions: fresh Catalan wild mushrooms prepared and served in a Japanese style, in one of the city's most exciting restaurants.

L'HAVANA

Catalan home cooking

The name evokes the private restaurants of the Cuban capital La Hayana, the paladares, family-run businesses that serve homemade food in private houses, and the informal atmosphere and the unfussy traditional cooking give this restaurant a genuinely homey feel. The hearty aromas of their dishes of the day attract a clientele who can sniff a filling meal at a reasonable price from streets away. You'll find uncomplicated Catalan cuisine: wild mushrooms with scrambled eggs, the classic grilled royellons – saffron milk-caps – as well as fricandeau, meatballs and even pigs' trotters, all served with wild mushrooms.



PITARRA

Theatrical tastes

On the Ramblas, at the entrance to Carrer Escudellers and directly in front of Bar Cosmos, there's an imposing statue, a popular meeting place - and pigeon roost. It commemorates Pitarra, the pen-name of Frederic Soler, a 19th century



Catalan playwright. Make your way a little deeper in the Gothic quarter and you'll find the house where he used to live on Carrer Avinyó, now a restaurant dedicated to his memory, and also to the best of Catalan cuisine. It's a pillar of the Barcelona restaurant scene, and proudly serves dishes that are hard to find elsewhere: civet of wild boar, monkfish suquet with ceps and prawns, and partridge in wild mushroom sauce.

QUIM DE LA BOQUERIA

From the forest to the market

If you want the best ingredients, you go to the source. But since most Barcelonans can't make it to the forests of the Pyrenees to pick their own wild mushrooms, they rely on markets like La Boqueria to bring the forest to the city. That's where you'll find Quim, the quintessential Boqueria eating place, whose menu is based directly on what's available from the stalls. Pull up a stool to the tiny bar for a mushroom feast: their wild mushroom timbale with foie gras and fried egg, baby squid with golden chanterelles, or porcini and prawn risotto with black horn of plenty mushrooms - all against the

backdrop of the Boqueria market and its colourful fauna.

TRAM-TRAM

Classical and modern

Like wild mushrooms themselves, which can be found in the humblest home-cooking and the most sophisticated cuisine, and travel from the dampest corners of the forest to the most sumptuous tables, there are restaurants that combine the earthy and the luxurious - and achieve spectacular results. Tram-Tram, at the heart of the swish Sarrià district, is one such, a Barcelona classic constantly re-inventing itself to keep pace with the times. A traditional town house, elegantly refurbished inside, is the perfect frame for a sophisticated take on Catalan cooking: arròs de colomí - rice with squabs and mushrooms - creamed wild mushrooms with soft boiled eggs and essence of foie gras, or the cep and Iberian ham croquettes.

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Tasting the city

If there's one thing Barcelona has aplenty it's tasting tours and cookery courses, aimed at foodies and novices alike. **Ricard Martín** tucks in his napkin and samples a few

There's no better way to experience a new city than by tucking into its food, and as a place that's justly proud of its gastronomic heritage, Barcelona offers dozens of ways to sip, slurp and savour your way to a better understanding of its food culture. From sweet treats, tapas tours and wine-tastings to cookery workshops, there's something to tickle everyone's taste buds.

Tapas by vespa

Bernard Onghena is a Belgian who moved to Barcelona twenty years ago – he's practically a native, and he puts all his hard-won knowledge of the city at your disposal on his Barcelona Vespa Tours. Astride a stylish Vespa LX50 scooter, doing your best to keep up with your scooter-riding guide, you visit three of the city's districts, with a tapas stop in each one. Culinary highlights

Cooking up a storm

Cook & Taste have been organizing cookery workshops aimed at visitors for eight years. "We like all our courses to have a personal touch," says Begoña Sanchis, the owner. They offer morning or afternoon sessions, in which visitors and locals learn to master four or five classic recipes: these always include paella, and other local dishes such as escalivada – grilled vegetable salad-or brandada de bacalao –a creamy salt cod purée – and at least one recipe that includes romesco, the archetypal Catalan sauce. Before they head for their regular seats at the Camp Nou, this family-run restaurant is where the gourmets among FC Barcelona's legions of fans stop for some pre-match sustenance. Close to the Barca stadium, Leku offers an enticing range of dishes à la carte and a fantastic set lunch menu. Young chef Sergi Amor gives free rein to his vast culinary knowledge, re-imagining traditional recipes to create the innovative, healthy dishes that modern diners expect. He's a dedicated market-goer, sourcing the best ingredients - for example, insisting on Agria potatoes for frying and the results can be spectacular. His unique take on patatas bravas, or his quail chupa-chups with red salsa justify his obsessive quest for perfection. The starter menu includes delicious bunyols de bacallà - goldenbrown salt cod fritters - and a mini torta de Casar cheese, served with violet petal jam. His crunchy spinach fries are a real discovery. -Marcelo Abaricio

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Falling into temptation

With its selection of original clothes, accessories and designer objects, Verdejade in Gràcia is a treasure trove full of temptations. By **Laia Beltran**

It's hard to walk past Verdejade without stopping for a closer look. It's not a huge window, but there's always something that catches your eve. Or is it just the enticing way the display is arranged? The mystery is solved when owner Eugénia Molina explains that she's an interior designer by training. Verdejade is her studio, and also a shop where she sells things she loves, from clothes and accessories to decorative household objects. And she really does walk the talk: today she's wearing a shirt dress from Swedish label Rules by Mary, and vintage-style earrings from Sevillian designer Pepa Miró.

Her personal style is reflected everywhere you look - she'd look just at home in one of AiCarmelal's original designs, stylish dresses cut from trousers, or wearing a necklace from Mushamba, a Brazilian designer who specialises in fabric jewellery. She could accessorize with hairclips by Colorin Colorado, Clàudia Font's woolly hats or Rules by Mary's handbags. In fact, I can picture her on the sofa at home, resting on a Donna Wilson cushion, as she sips her first coffee of the day from one of Vicente Rivera's hand-painted ceramic cups, repressing a smile at Ingela P. Arrhenius's gorgeously colourful matryoshka dolls. She'd have made a feature of one wall with Tres Tinta's up-to-the minute wallpapers - or perhaps a striking cut-out mural design from Myvinyl? And she'd definitely have a print from Valencian designer Paula Bonet - but which of her rosy-cheeked damsels would it be? The languid indie babe? The fox lady? The tousle-haired diver? These are the questions that tempt you in to Verdejade's deliciously decorative world.



Animal Magic

Barcelona zoo is 120 years old this year, looking to the future and a long-awaited refurbishment. **Eugènia Sendra** takes a walk with the flamingos

The story of Barcelona Zoo goes back much further than Snowflake, the albino gorilla that was its most famous resident. In fact, it began with a collection of 'exotic and native animals,' donated to the city by businessman Lluis Martí Codolar, and first put on show to the public in the Ciutadella Park on September 24, 1892.

Today the eternally elegant flamingos and the occasional unruffled peacock welcome visitors to the zoo. It's an institution that has always moved with the times, adapting itself to changing needs: as it celebrates its 120th anniversary it is embarking on a major redesign, which will bring it in line with the latest ideas in conservation. The new zoo will have a range of different biomes - for primates, birds, reptiles, the Sahel savannah, American, African and South American jungles, and the Mediterranean, all connected by a system of ramps, A new

dolphinarium is also planned. But fans of the zoos most popular residents—the elephants, the Komodo dragons (which are expecting new additions to the family in November) and the cetaceans—have nothing to worry about: none of the animals are leaving the zoo.

Nowadays, the zoo's priority is the conservation of species in danger of extinction, with the emphasis on breeding and reintroduction programs. Gone are the days when the zoo sold birds as a source of income, or the hardships of the 1936-39 Civil War, when many of the animals starved to death. Gone too are the zoo's most famous residents - before Snowflake, and Ulysses, the killer whale that left for Sea World when he grew too big for his tank. And in 1927 there was the first elephant many city residents had ever seen, nicknamed L'Avi-Grandpa-although "he" wasn't a he, or even that old.



Architecture 48H Open House BCN




This month, Barcelona celebrates its third Open House architecture festival, as part of an international event founded in London in 1992 and now adopted by 21 cities around the world. The festival has already proved a hit in a city with a highly visible 20th century architectural heritage, and this year more than 150 buildings will open their doors to the public.

The programme for 2012 features many new inclusions: repurposed buildings like the Fàbrica del Sucre (Jordi Garcés, 2011), an industrial complex in Poble Nou that housed a distillery in 1916, and whose five buildings have been converted into 29 designer lofts; working buildings like the city's wholesale flower market, Mercabarna-Flor (Willy Müller, 2008), whose distinctive roof with its sharp folds and bright colours reflects the goods on sale inside; and the a chance to visit the interior of the Magic Fountains on Montjuïc, built by Carles Burgas in 1929. The list also maintains some of the most popular attractions from previous years, such as Enric Ruíz Geli's 2010 Media-Tic building, or the Casa Pérez Samanillo, headquarters of the Equestrian Society.

Cocktails with a little extra something

If you like your cocktail with a soundtrack, you're in luck: Fizz and Slow combine live music with top tipples. By **Ricard Martín**

We've all been there: the first sip of your perfectly-mixed cocktail ruined by background Muzak better suited to a Dallas lift circa 1981. When it comes to the finer things in life, it's all or nothing - you have to get it right. So be thankful for shiny new cocktail joint Fizz, which opened only three months ago. Located in the "left" side of the Eixample district - natural home for bars of all descriptions - its young owner Jordi Goetz is a mixologist by training and a music-lover by nature. "I love bartending but music comes first." He saw a gap in the market: "In Barcelona, there's this idea that a bar that puts on a live band has to have wooden fittings and Guinness on tap. There are plenty of people out there who love live music but don't want to sit on a wooden stool or drink pints."

Goetz puts on live acts at Fizz on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, duos and trios playing everything from acoustic indie rock to blues and rockabilly. They take over the tiny stage from midnight on Thursday and Friday, 11pm on Saturdays. With its dark velvety interior, Fizz is one of those bars that sets the scene for a serious drink, and the comprehensive cocktail menu doesn't disappoint.

The cocktails-plus-music meme is obviously spreading: barely half a dry martini away you'll find Slow, which has recently re-opened its doors. It's possibly the only cocktail bar in the city with its own nightclub, on the upper floor, lit by dazzling LED arrays, with Unplugged sessions and DIs.
