The Barcelona-based architect is excited about the new

Enric Miralles Foundation, an exhibition space that is permanently under construction. By **Ada Castells**

Where did the idea for the Enric Miralles Foundation come from?

The idea had been around forever. Enric was the architect behind the Scottish Parliament and the Santa Caterina Market here in Barcelona, and while he was still alive, we had the idea of opening a space to the public. We wanted to open up part of the office. And now is the time to do it.

In the middle of a financial crisis? Yes, a lot of people have told me

I'm crazy, but we're going to do it gradually, as we find funding.

It's a beautiful place, at Passatge de la Pau, 10, just off the bottom of the Ramblas. Was it essential to find a location in Barcelona?

Barcelona has a potential that we residents sometimes don't see. The city's reputation and ability to inspire

affection are global phenomena. Everyone wants to come and visit Barcelona. The building dates to the end of the 19th century, when the standard of architecture here was especially high, even compared to the rest of the world.

It's also a space with a very positive vibe. Do you believe in Feng Shui?

I find it interesting, and in fact, the exhibitions we'll be putting on won't just focus on architecture, but also on all these more mysterious topics.

MERCANTIC

Mercantic is a permanent second-hand furniture, antiques and curios market that occupies a disused ceramics factory on the outskirts of Sant Cugat del Vallès (reachable by FGC train from Barcelona). Unlike many another run-down flea market, the interior has a sort of faded bourgeois elegance. On entering, you're confronted by rows of colourful sheds that recall the Serpette market in Paris. Inside one of the gigantic warehouses you could spend hours delving among lamps, chests of drawers, tables and chairs... another is stacked with

second-hand books. And when your feet start to give out, there's always the café terrace.

SANTA LLÚCIA

Christmas in Barcelona wouldn't be complete without a stroll round Santa Llúcia market, which fills the Cathedral square for several weeks. Some people go for the festive atmosphere: others to keep up a family tradition of buying a tree, decorations, and all the things without which a Catalan Christmas wouldn't be complete –including the famous 'caganer,' a squatting,





pooping Nativity scene figurine, or the 'Tió de Nadal' the festive log that poops out children's presents on Christmas Eve.



PASSEIG DELUXE

Passeig de Gràcia is one of the most expensive shopping streets in the world, where Modernista architecture houses international luxury labels such as Chanel, Gucci, Valentino and Loewe, shoulder to shoulder with well-established local names.

BRAND HEAVEN

At the heart of the Gothic quarter, the biggest multinational clothing brands are clustered along Portal de l'Angel and Portaferrissa: Zara, H&M, Mango, Bershka, Massimo Dutti, Benetton and Intimissimi. Duck down any sidestreet to escape the identikit crowds.

RAVAL RAMBLES

Local fans of the Raval spend so much time wandering its maze of streets they've invented a word for it - 'ravalejar'. Taking the Barce-Iona Museum of Contemporary Art (MACBA) as a starting point, you can loop round the shops on Joaquim Costa and Ferlandina to one side, and Elisabets, Doctor Dou and Pintor Fortuny to the other. There's no excuse for missing out on Costura, Les Topettes, Fusta'm and La Variété, And for fans of vintage and second-hand clothes. there's the concentration of shops on Riera Baixa, including gems like Motel and Galalith.






